As I am sure you are aware, Year 6 children have been busy preparing for their end of Key Stage 2 SATs (Statutory Assessment Tests). These tests take place during **the week beginning 14th May 2018**. The final confirmed timetable for the tests is set out below. We all want the children to do their very best in all the tests and we would like them to be refreshed and focused during the week. Therefore, we have decided that there will be no home learning next week as we would prefer the children to focus on revision for each test. If you would like to carry out revision tasks with your child, we suggest practising the Year 5/6 spelling words (attached again), revisiting the revision home learning tasks sent home for each subject (reading, spelling, punctuation and grammar and maths) over the last few weeks and if you have any revision guides at home, these will also be useful to work through. We would also encourage your children to read as much as possible.

In order for the children to be prepared for sitting the tests, we kindly ask that all children get a good night's sleep and a good breakfast before each test. We look forward to seeing them promptly at the start of each day ready to do their best with the positive attitude they have been showing all year. The children will be provided with all the equipment needed for the tests.

Unfortunately, in the event of children missing any tests, they will receive no marks, so it is very important that they attend all the tests. **Please advise your children that SATs week is an illness free week!** If they do fall severely ill, please inform school immediately.
